#### Section 4: First aid measures

#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

Skin contact: Remove all contaminated clothes and footwear immediately unless stuck to skin.

Drench the affected skin with running water for 10 minutes or longer if substance is still

on skin. Transfer to hospital if there are burns or symptoms of poisoning.

Eye contact: Immediately irrigate with eyewash solution or clean water, holding the eyelids apart, for

at least 10 minutes. Obtain immediate medical attention.

Ingestion: Wash out mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting. Give 1 cup of water to drink every 10

minutes. If unconscious, check for breathing and apply artificial respiration if necessary.

Transfer to hospital as soon as possible.

Inhalation: Remove casualty from exposure ensuring one's own safety whilst doing so. If

unconscious, check for breathing and apply artificial respiration if necessary. If

conscious, ensure the casualty sits or lies down. If breathing becomes bubbly, have the

casualty sit and provide oxygen if available. Transfer to hospital as soon as possible.
